

Chapter 4 – General Rules

Transportation

The transport network is a significant and essential resource for the City and contributes to the social and economic well-being of residents, visitors and businesses.



Overview

The City's transport network provides access to and from one of the country's key ports, a busy airport and is essential for Tauranga's continued growth and economic success.

It is important that this network is managed safely, efficiently and effectively, now and in the future, to ensure the continued successful development of the area.



Current Rules

- Current transportation provisions outline the requirements for access, parking and manoeuvring and when a traffic impact assessment should be submitted.



Key Changes Proposed

- The transportation provisions will retain and update the technical requirements for parking, access and manoeuvring while providing a more holistic approach to managing the transportation network.
- Objectives and policies have been modified or included to reflect the direction and intent of Council strategies .
- Parking Impact Fee Zones are being extended and a new zone introduced to compliment the City Centre Living Zone.
- Activity parking requirements have been updated and include requirements for bicycle parking.
- New requirements have been included for the provision of integrated transport assessments.
- Restricting access to the arterial road network.



Reason for the Change

- The proposed transportation provisions aim to create an integrated transport network to ensure the safe, effective and sustainable use of this resource.
